Our mission remains the same: to support people while using a participatory approach. The emphasis is still on the human relationship as the driving force for the transfer of skills, the strengthening of existing capacities in the countries of intervention and the close collaboration with our competent partners on site.

What is happening in Chad?

A little reminder... We started our project in Chad last January, in partnership with two local associations, Les Amis du Progrès 2 AP and Parvis des Enfants (ASPAEN), represented by their presidents Djasnabaye Samnalngar and Roger Dalam. Since February, our partners have started organizing events to offer hand washing stations to various schools, social centers and vulnerable families. These stations were locally manufactured and equipped with our The Drop® faucet. During the events, beneficiaries also received information on the importance of handwashing, communicable diseases, and instructions on how to use the tap properly.

ASPAEN's president is a photographer and videographer and we are grateful for all that he captured with his camera. This photo, taken in the Special Education Center for Retarded Children (CESER), was accompanied by a video of all the students, teachers and ASPAEN staff saying thank you to ADED.



In May, the president of ASPAEN made a trip to Sarh, to visit our other partner and to do media coverage for the project. The two competent partners spent time together in the field doing demonstrations, visiting the different project sites and raising awareness among the beneficiaries.

In Tambacounda, Jérémie Kipré has installed a NEENE FOUTA rope pump. ADED collaborates with Jérémie to install pumps at his clients' homes.

This particular pump works with a simple, manual technology that allows groundwater to be easily brought to the surface. This well is 15 meters deep. In the coming weeks, a second pump will be installed in Sandiara.
