# Feedback on the Senegal trip

Jean-Marc and Nathalie have been traveling regularly to Senegal for over 20 years. A glimpse of their latest trip!

Once again, we were able to travel to Senegal in March with a team of 10 people, many of whom were in Africa for the first time. Our trip had a special feel to it, as part of the team traveled for 4 days to the 9th World Water Forum held near Dakar, to promote The Drop® hand wash from Links to Water Development.

During this stay, we were also able to visit the ADED project in Ndiaganiao under the responsibility of Demba Sene, who was elected deputy mayor. It is a beautiful project that works well and where the collaboration between parents, students and teachers is a success. We were able to discuss with some of the authorities and our meeting ended with a meal. We were also able to go to the suburbs of Mbour for a visit of the work among the talibé children under the guidance of Jérémie Diouf.

The second week of our trip, after spending a night in the desert, we went to the Djoudj where we met Cheikh Diouneydi Gaye with whom we had already collaborated several years ago. We were able to visit several schools on the outskirts of the Djoudj National Bird Park, where we were able to see the problem of hand washing and sanitary facilities. In order to have a global vision of the situation, we were accompanied during these days by Professor Seydou Niang and we were also able to meet the curator of the national park. The work is enormous, but the challenge is worth it. And still under the guidance of Cheikh, we visited various projects related to agriculture. Currently, we are in discussion with several partners to design a new project in this region!



# A New Collaboration in Cameroon

Since February 2022, we have developed a new collaboration with a partner of choice in Mbalmayo, Cameroon, Alternatives Durables pour le Développement. From the start, our ambitions and wishes were identical: to support the largest number of people in a perspective of inclusion. To do this, we have been conducting a situation study since the end of March, which involves frequent exchanges with the targeted populations. The objective? To jointly define an intervention program so that it is the most appropriate and that the population can take ownership of it. This approach involves setting up committees composed of beneficiaries who can make suggestions to the people in charge of the project. The other objective is also to establish statistical indicators, which will allow us to measure our progress in the project and the possible difficulties to solve. As for the content, it is still under development. We will have to wait for the next newsletter to know more...
