

Stepping out of the box also means accepting to leave one's comfort zone, be less in control and trust others more! For ADED this means, among other things, collaborating with local partners, living thousands of kilometers away from us, in another continent, sometimes in another hemisphere, in another climate (while we experienced an exceptional drought in Switzerland, our African partners experienced floods!), in another culture, eating other foods, speaking another language, etc.

As you read this news, you will discover how ADED is embarking on new themes and expanding its field of action, but always in the field of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), while trusting and strengthening its relationships with its local partners, whom we appreciate more and more and of whom we are proud.

I hope these clues will help you find the solution to the above game. The solution is on the last page.



As you know, in the last few months we have been working on our 2022 - 2025 strategy. Today we are giving you more information on the various themes on which our interventions will focus!

First of all, we are acting on the level of access to drinking water in places where it is restricted. Installing hygiene and sanitation infrastructures makes no sense if the local population does not have access to water. We opt for the best solution according to the context, as is the case for example in Malawi where we provide a water purification system that works thanks to a ceramic filter and is produced locally. At the same time, we are focusing on hand hygiene and awareness raising, two areas where we have a lot of expertise from our experience. These components will be present in each of our projects. Finally, we are developing a sanitation component in some of our projects. The objective is, at the end of this period, to master sanitation and related practices to effectively fight against open defecation. Indeed, we are convinced that a global response to communicable diseases linked to poor hygiene requires the improvement of sanitation means as well as knowledge and practices linked to it.

In the field of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene, all themes are linked and therefore, all aspects come up in our projects!

Drinking water project "Schoolwater" in Karakalpakstan

We told you before about our project in Karakalpakistan, where ADED is involved as a technical partner. Here is some news!

After identifying the needs and the problem to be addressed, ADED studied and proposed a sustainable, economic, ecological and social solution, without the use of chemicals, aiming at potabilizing the water delivered by the pipeline to supply storage tanks.

Unfortunately, travel restrictions introduced as a result of successive waves of Covid-19 slowed down preparations for the implementation of the pilot project. Project implementation was only accelerated in the fall of 2021. Jean-Marc WARIDEL for ADED and Gilles JLIL from Aqua Swiss went to Uzbekistan from May 12 to 21, 2022 for the realization of the drinking water treatment plant in the school of Tik Ozek. The plant was successfully commissioned on May 20, 2022, during a ceremony attended by the governor of Moynaq district and the prosecutor of the region. The Karakalpakistan TV channel's video of this handover ceremony is available on the website.

In this region, where not only the quantity and quality of water are a challenge, but also the continental desert climate, marked by a large temperature range, cold winters, hot summers and scarce rainfall, had to be taken into account. A drinking water distribution network in the corridors of the Tik Ozek school now supplies water points where students fill their water bottles and cups, as well as hand-washing stations equipped with The Drop® ecosanitary faucet from Links to Water Development SA, at the main entrances of the building.

Unfortunately, serious unrest took place in Karakalpakistan in early July 2022. Dozens of people were killed. The people of Nukus demonstrated against the change of the constitution, thus depriving Karakalpakistan of the right to separate from Uzbekistan. The lack of drinking water is one of the most serious grievances of the population. Our project is therefore more necessary than ever, but we must wait a few weeks to let the situation stabilize.

Our three new projects

Malawi

The new project in Malawi will take place in the complex context of the refugee camp of Dzaleka. We collaborate with the association YOCODESOP, whose members come mainly from the DRC and live in the camp.

Our objectives?

- The improvement of drinking water supply and hygiene infrastructures in schools of the camp. In this way, we hope to improve the daily life of young refugees, who mostly were born in the camp and grew up here.
- The development of a local soap factory in order to strengthen and enhance local skills.
- The strengthening of skills of our local partner on both a technical and managerial level. Four members of the project team are doing internships with Welthungerhilfe, an organization we collaborate with on the ground.



Democratic Republic of the Congo

This project takes place in the province of Sankuru, a region that is particularly isolated from the rest of the country. That is why we are working hand in hand with local village leaders, a Kinshasa-based organization (Congo Biodiversity and Sustainable Development), a local organization (Avenir des Enfants de Sankuru) and the Methodist Mission of the Province, to coordinate this project.

Our objectives?

- The reinforcement of the access to quality water and in sufficient quantity in the schools.
- The construction and rehabilitation of two schools to improve the learning and teaching conditions of the students and the teaching staff.
- The improvement of sanitation and hygiene infrastructures in the schools, with an emphasis on the fight against open defecation.
- The capacity-building and strengthening of skills of our local partners and the local population.

Cameroon

The third project takes place in a country we know well, Cameroon. This new project will be carried out in collaboration with our local partner "Alternatives Durables pour le Développement" in the Centre Region of the country.

Our objectives?

- To improve access to water by developing water sources and building improved wells.
- The construction and improvement of hygiene and sanitation infrastructures in institutions of the targeted villages.
- The support of local populations in the realization of income generating activities is directly linked to the improvement of this drinking water supply.
- The structuring of the mobilized communities and the development of activities in synergy with all the actors of the Water, Sanitation and Hygiene sector, taking a gender approach.

It is an honour for me to relay the important role that our organization represents in the Dzaleka camp. 
The monthly donation!
